## Moveathon at Downsview Park helps kids with special needs

Thousands of people are heading to Downsview Park Sunday, June 8, to help youngsters with physical and developmental disabilities.

And they'll have a great time in the process.

The 17th annual Zareinu Moveathon Festival, a day filled with food, rides, entertainment and sports events, will raise money for the Zareinu Educational Centre.

With an administrative office in North York and a school in Thornhill, the centre provides therapies and treatments for children with special needs so they can reach their full potential.

A feature of the festival will be the Zareinu Experience, an interactive educational zone where people can learn what youngsters with disabilities experience every day.

The event will also feature a one-kilometre kids' run, five- and 10-kilometre runs, five- and 10-kilometre Kangoo runs, a 20-kilometre family bike ride, a two-kilometre family walk, power paddle boats, a rock wall, a swing carousel, a bungee run, a merry-go-round, pony rides, a petting zoo, meltdown and cannon blaster rides and a fantasy circus.

The festival runs from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. and can be accessed through the entrance at Sheppard Avenue and John Drury Drive.

said the UCT event will be the first time he's spoken to a Jewish group in Toronto since 2000, and the first time to a Jewish group in Canada since 2002.

"I am asked why we bother, so long after (the Second World War)," he said of the question he's most asked.

"They are old men, it was so long ago, why don't you just let them die in peace?" There is not, and never should be, a statute of limitations on the murder of innocent people. It must be made clear that a Jewish life has value, and that the murder of a Jew will be pursued relentlessly, without a time limit. Thousands of war criminals, to the great shame of the Jewish community, escaped trial and died in middle- or upper-class beds in Ontario and

Quebec and elsewhere throughout Canada and the USA, and we could have prevented that from happening."

His Nazi hunting work is done pro bono because "every member of the community who possesses a special skill has an obligation to make that skill available to the community," he said.

"Doctors are obligated to donate time at a free clinic. Lawyers should do pro bono work. I am an investigator, so I donate investigative activity in

the public interest and/or assist persons who otherwise would not be able to obtain investigative assistance."

Dave Gordon, UCT fundraiser co-ordinator, said there isn't a set goal the organization is hoping to raise, adding Rambam will take audience questions.

The investigator, who is founder and director of investigative agency Pallorium Inc., is set to star in television show *Rambam Gets His Man*, which will debut Aug. 4 on Investigation Discovery at 10 p.m.

An RSVP to the fundraiser must be received by Wednesday, June 11.

Tickets to the dinner and speech cost \$125, and speech-only tickets cost \$30.
